KICK UP YOUR BOOTS.

Saddle up to discover lively communities that blend buckaroo, Basque, and American Indian traditions. As you motor down Nevada's stretch of Interstate 80, you'll encounter lore-packed museums, Western festivals and artisans, and mouthwatering cuisine from some of the state's most historic eateries.

- Brush up on buckaroo culture at museums, heritage centers, and Western shops
- Dig into hearty, family-style Basque feasts at century-old dinner houses
- Set your own land speed record at West Wendover's Bonneville Salt Flats

- Dip your toes in one of the crispest, clearest, and oldest bodies of water on Earth
- Hit up the cuisine, boutique, and public art scenes around bohemian Reno
- Soak up Nevada history at museums, old saloons, and hot spring resorts

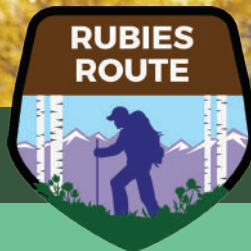

EXPLORE NEW ROUTES.

With the cowboy-cool town of Elko as your hub, follow this route's wild spokes to some of Nevada's most coveted and surprising scenic treasures. Tackle trails in glacier-carved Lamoille Canyon. Or watch wildlife at Angel Lake and Ruby Lake National Wildlife Refuge.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Hike, fish, and find memorable moments in spectacular Lamoille Canyon
- Birdwatch and kayak the labyrinthine waters of Ruby Lake
- Dirt-road it 50 miles over wilderness passes to the off-grid town of Jarbidge

MAKE A BLACK ROCK RUN.

Come trace the art-lined route Burners take on their annual pilgrimage “home” to Burning Man, the wildest arts event on Earth in the mystical Black Rock Desert. Discover a magical road trip that celebrates Nevada’s do-it-yourself verve and spunky “why not” attitude.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Explore the Black Rock Desert playa—one of Earth’s largest, flattest surfaces
- Gaze upon magnificent, kaleidoscopic Fly Geyser on a guided nature tour
- Cast for salmon-sized trout and discover Paiute culture at Pyramid Lake

FIND OTHERWORLDLY FUN.



When you pilot your vessel along the wide-open roads through this Martian wilderness, you'll get why a "visitor" would cross the galaxy to enjoy this slice of the Silver State. Feast your curiosity on otherworldly-themed restaurants, inns, and shops out here in alien country.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Pose with alien murals and savor spacey snacks at E.T. Fresh Jerky
- Shop for spaced-out souvenirs at the Alien Research Center
- Hear locals' tales over Alien Beers and Saucer Burgers at the Little A'Le'Inn

DISCOVER GREAT ART.

US-95 is where psychedelic free-range art meets the American West. We're talking kaleidoscopic boulder towers, a color-changing "forest" of junk cars, "post-playa" Burning Man sculptures, and plenty of other amazingly odd art installations, galleries, and iconic places.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Shop and art-hop around the Las Vegas Arts District, AKA "18b"
- Get ghosted at Goldwell Open Air Museum and Rhyolite ghost town
- Snap a pic of some art on a vertical vehicle at the International Car Forest

EXPLORE THE DESERT'S HEART.

The road from Las Vegas to Death Valley National Park is one of contrasts. We're talking the lowest point in North America and nearly 12,000-foot Mt. Charleston. Rugged biker bars and elegant wineries. Sprawling sand dunes and ancient bristlecone pines. Ready to get extreme?

HIGHLIGHTS

- Discover Death Valley: the hottest, driest, and lowest place in North America
- Ponder the past in Rhyolite, one of the West's best ghost towns
- Hike (or even snowshoe) among 5,000-year-old bristlecone pine forests

PACK YOUR STAR CHART.

Positively brimming with grandeur, this route begins with red rock spires and sandstone canyons and ends with mountain peaks, ancient bristlecone pine forests, and some of the country's darkest, most star-studded skies. One trip and you'll get the "great" in Great Basin Highway.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Marvel at red rock formations in Valley of Fire State Park
- Navigate the slot canyons of Cathedral Gorge State Park
- Discover why "half the park is after dark" at Great Basin National Park

ESCAPE THE NEON GLOW.



If you're looking for places to go beyond the glow, this three-pronged package of mini day trips will have you exploring world-famous Hoover Dam, outdoor playgrounds like Red Rock Canyon and Valley of Fire, exciting attractions, and charming towns.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Tour a famous wonder of the engineering world at Hoover Dam
- Hike, cycle, or rock climb at Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area
- Wander among wildlife and ancient petroglyphs at Valley of Fire State Park
